COLLECTIONS RESEARCH REQUEST FORM INTERNATIONAL COLLECTIONS ADDENDUM

The Peabody Institute recognizes that item and archival collections which originate from outside of the United States were also generally collected from Indigenous communities through colonialist practices. The Peabody Institute acknowledges that descendant communities, of all nationalities, may have a vested interest in access to, and research conducted on, material collected from their culture.

Formal and informal relationships between federal governments and Indigenous communities vary from country to country. The Peabody Institute respects the authority of the appropriate recognized legal entity to represent Indigenous communities in the country of origin for each collection. For example, the National Institute of Anthropology and History (INAH) in Mexico or the Ministry of Culture in Peru.

The Peabody Institute requires researchers requesting access on international collections to contact the appropriate legal entity in the country of origin to inform them of the research activity. All publications containing results of the research must also be shared with those legal entities.

Researchers requesting access to collections material that originated in Canada should follow a similar procedure to that outlined in the standard Collections Research Request Form. Consultation with First Nations, Inuit, and Metis tribal governments is required for access to that material.
